Some Thoughts of the Season

As I sit down to write this newsletter article, I am also preparing for a funeral service four days from now. The service is for one of my best friends, someone who truly was my "best" friend for about 15 years of my life. I met Carl when we were nine years old, in the fourth grade, and we were probably best friends until our mid-twenties, When we got married and had kids, we kind of drifted apart a bit, but we always stayed in touch, we always saw each other at least a few times a year since then, we always stayed a part of each other's lives. What I'm struggling most with right now, I think, is the finality of death. I just can't believe that I'm never going to see or talk with my friend again in this life. That feeling of loss is very difficult.

I'm sure we all have gone through similar experiences and emotions. Of course, all of us deal with these things in different ways. But, in reflecting upon my friend, what comes to mind, for me, is how Jesus' friends must have felt between Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Obviously, Jesus predicted his Passion and death many times for them, and assured them of his Resurrection as well, but in those dark three days before Easter, they didn't seem to get the memo. They were filled with fear and dread, as well as grief and sorrow. The brutality of Jesus' death most certainly added to their trauma. I think of Mary, eyes filled with tears, dragging herself to Jesus' tomb on Easter morning. What must have been going through her mind? Probably some of the same emotions I'm experiencing right now.

Of course, we all know how Jesus' story ends on Easter morning - with joy, with celebration, with Resurrection. I can't imagine how Jesus' friends must have felt when he appeared to them once again. How wonderful that must have been!



And I truly believe that the joy is sweeter because of the dark days, the grief and the loss and the sorrow that preceded it. That's what Resurrection is, after all - new life after death.

So many people nowadays want to avoid the hard and difficult part of the story. Very few people attend Holy Week services anymore. Very few people want to travel that part of the journey. I remember hearing a story about the Good Friday services at Joel Osteen's megachurch in Houston, Texas. His wife, Victoria, strode out onto the stage at the beginning of the service, in her expensive clothes and perfect hair and perfect teeth, and announced to the gathered crowd, while beaming with a huge, bright, smile, "Isn't it great that we worship a risen Lord!" followed by massive applause. Not to be judgmental, but I think Victoria is missing the point of Good Friday.

Good Friday reminds us that God is present for us in the grief and the loss and the sorrow as well as the joy and celebrations. And it makes the assurance of Easter all the more profound. Like Mary and Peter, and the rest of Jesus' disciples who were reunited with their friend on Easter, I hope to see my good friend again. And I hope I will remember to thank Jesus for making it possible.

- Hear Us Out For April meeting personal story that has shaped you.
- Sharon PNEC PA Annual report filing, 2025 PA requires businesses included churches to file a financial report... June 30 filing due date. Pastor Bob to review with Mary and file.
- Don purchased two new outside trash cans.
- Fire alarm proposals received two estimates, Protect Alarm and Kistler O'Brien; significant variation in quotes; Don met w/Kistler O'Brien, he reviewed the proposal, and his proposal will cover new system. 
