Some Thoughts of the Season

from Pastor Bob Gutekunst

Well, the holiday season is past, and we are into the new year -2025! Someone commented to me, during the holiday season just concluded, "It's pointless to go on a diet and try to lose some weight during this time of the year!" It's kind of true. You go from Halloween candy to a Thanksgiving feast, to Christmas cookies and other treats, to another feast on Christmas day, to some champagne on New Year's Eve. Maybe that's why many people wait until the new year to try and lose some weight. That's, generally speaking, what many New Year's resolutions involve-trying to improve oneself. Whether it's trying to lose some weight, or exercise more, or just generally improve one's health, or be more productive at work, or accomplish any number of worthwhile tasks, that's usually what our New Year's resolutions are all about-trying to achieve more, trying to be more productive, trying to be better than we were. It can be kind of stressful, and anxious, and exhausting, because, let's be honest, most people have a really hard time sticking with their resolutions. They, more often than not, last until about February, and then we give up on them.

I read an article that caught my attention. It talked about a different kind of New Year's resolution - doing more things we enjoy, being kinder and more gracious to ourselves, loving ourselves more. I liked these kinds of resolutions, so I am including some of them for you to consider.

- 1. Continue journaling. I started keeping a journal last Christmas, and I'm so proud that it's now December, and I've kept it up for almost a year! It's been great for my mental health and helped force me into a habit and routine. For around 30 to 40 minutes, I disconnect from all my tech, screens, work, etc., and make myself a cup of tea, sit down, and pour my thoughts onto a page."
- 2. Be kinder to myself and learn to love myself more."

- 3. Do my best. Try to stay positive but forgive myself when I'm not. Try to figure out where the negativity is coming from.
- 4. Spread more kindness and love. There's too much bad going on to waste time being hateful and mean."
- 5. Give myself space to learn and create, without worrying about outcome or goal, but with some dedication toward doing hard things."
- 6. Travel more.
- 7. Find my favorite Jane Austen novel. My mom's favorite is Pride and Prejudice, and my aunt's is Persuasion."
- 8. Find true love.
- 9. Take more time for myself mentally and emotionally. I hate being stressed and overwhelmed all the time.
- 10. No expectations.
- 11. Smile more.
- 12. Stop fighting with people
- 13. Do the things I want to do by myself. I'm challenging myself in small steps to do the things I'm scared to do alone. For example, going to a movie I want to see by myself because I can do things I want alone."
- 14. Learn to stop blaming myself when things go wrong.

The article concludes with a quote from Captain Picard of the Star Trek franchise, "Remember that it is possible to commit no error and still lose. That is not a weakness. That is life." Maybe these suggestions will help you to put less pressure on yourself, especially around New Year's, and do some things for yourself. As Christians, of course, we are called to love others. But that calling begins by first loving ourselves. Love yourself a little more this year.
