Some Thoughts of the Season

from Pastor Bob Gutekunst

A few years ago, my wife and I were fortunate to be able to travel to Ireland for a friend's wedding. It was a wonderful experience. But, for many reasons, it was also a challenging one. For one thing, they drive on the wrong side of the road over there (they would say the same thing about us, I guess:). And the only rental cars we could get were manual transmission. Neither my wife or I had driven a stick shift in over twenty years, so that was a bit of an adjustment. Also, we discovered that a lot of the streets, even in the bigger cities, don't have street signs, which meant we got lost a few times. There were many things about the country that were different from our country, that were different from what we were used to.

Of course, some of those differences were positive ones. Like, for example, the fact that even though we did get lost on a few occasions, we discovered that, in Ireland, you can never really get lost, because every road, eventually, will take you out to a main road. In America, many people are isolated, spending inordinate amounts of time in front of a screen. In Ireland, people like to congregate together, with actual live human beings. The malls we went to were packed with people (I didn't see a single Amazon truck over there), and the pubs were filled every night of the week. Oh, and there was hardly any traffic over there. Sure, there was no air-conditioning in the middle of July. But it never got over 65 degrees, so we didn't really need it. And there were literally no bugs - no insects at all - on the entire island. So, overall, some challenges, but a lot of great new discoveries as well. I think all of the places I've been lucky enough to travel to have been like this. Journeying to someplace new, out of your comfort zone, can be difficult and rewarding at the same time.

Some Thoughts Continued...

I saw an interview with the travel writer, Rick Steves. He has become rich and famous for writing travel guides, and his travel philosophy is to travel to the less-touristy part of countries and to immerse oneself into the lifestyles of the people who live there. Rick Steves is also a person of faith. In the interview that I saw, he talked about how, for him, travel has become a spiritual practice. This made sense to me, because, no matter if we have travelled far and wide across this world, or never ventured far from home, we are all traveling spiritual journeys. No matter how young or old, experienced or inexperienced, whether we participate in a church or not, I believe that God is always calling us and pushing us, sometimes out of our comfort zones, to discover new things, and places, and people that bring us closer to God. Our spiritual journeys often challenge us, but they reward us as well.

The theme of "Travel" or "Journey" will be our theme for the season of Lent. Lent is a season that might seem challenging to many, as many equate this season with sacrifice, and "giving things up for Lent". The season is actually about turning more toward God, and discovering all of the wonderful rewards of a life following Jesus. And as we move through the season of Lent, we, in a spiritual sense, journey alongside Jesus, as he and his disciples journey toward Jerusalem and the cross. My aim, throughout the season, is to, hopefully, explore some of the spiritual components of our own travel experiences, and to connect the journeys of characters in the Scriptures - Jesus, Moses, Abraham and Sarah, Isaiah- with our own spiritual journeys. I hope and pray that you will join me on this journey. And don't worry. Even if we get lost a little, God promises us that we will always find our way home.


The first Sunday of every month is our Food Bank Donation collection. Please be supportive for our community Northampton Food Bank. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.


